Some Thoughts on Volunteering at JEC By Peter Leung, Elder

It's a gift in gratitude for God's graciousness to us. For many years, I gave my mother and mother-in-law corsages on Mother's Day. It was relatively expensive and it took two trips to the florist to order and then pick up them up. Additionally, I had to deliver them either Saturday afternoon or Sunday morning before church. I never regretted it. It was a small way to show my gratitude for their part in my life and to actively honor them. Similarly, perhaps all of us can look for ways we can show gratitude to our God through returning to Him part of our time and abilities in service to His church.

It's turning our thoughts and words into actions. Many years ago, I wondered if I had the "guts" to

It helps us get to know others in the church community, it gives us the opportunity to see God working in the lives of church friends and it gives us insight into the spiritual growth happening around us. Volunteering opens up opportunities for God to give us spiritual blessings and great memories to enjoy.
