Just Look Up! Excerpt from Fixing My Eyes on Jesus By Anne Graham Lotz

Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Hebrews 12:2

My mother tells the story of a former navy officer who kept up his weapons skills to qualify as a deputy sheriff in the county. Each year he was required to renew his

permit to keep his status as a deputy. One year, however, he wore new glasses to the target range, and when sweat steamed up his glasses,



he totally lost his focus on the target.

When my mother asked him, "What in the world did you do?", he

quoted the advice of his navy instructor: "When you lose sight of the target, remember your position." He remembered where he'd last seen the target and pulled the trigger. He hit the bull's-eye every time!

Ephesians 1:18 is a prayer that "the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which He has called

you." That hope is Jesus!

Stop looking ahead, looking around, or looking back. Keep your focus on Jesus. Just look up!
