Psalm 22 And Our Need For The Psalms Of Lament

What does it mean to lament in a biblical way?

"Lament is rooted in what we believe. It is a prayer loaded with theology. Belief in God's mercy, redemption and sovereignty create lament. Christians affirm that the world is broken, God is powerful, and He will be faithful. Therefore, lament stands in the gap between pain and promise . . . between heartbreak to hope. Lament is a prayer in pain that leads to trust. It's a path to praise as we are led through our brokenness and disappointment."

- ⁴ In you our fathers trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them.
- ⁵ To you they cried and were rescued; in you they trusted and were not put to shame.
- ⁶ But I am a worm and not a man, scorned by mankind and despised by the people.
- ⁷ All who see me mock me; they make mouths at me; they wag their heads;
- 8 "He trusts in the LORD; let him deliver him; let him rescue him, for he delights in him!"
- ⁹ Yet you are he who took me from the womb; you made me trust you at my mother's breasts.

- ²⁴For he has not despised or abhorred the affliction of the afflicted, and he has not hidden his face from him, but has heard, when he cried to him.
- ²⁵From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will perform before those who fear him.
- ²⁶The afflicted shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek him shall praise the LORD! May your hearts live forever!
- ²⁷All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD, and all the families of the nations shall worship before you.
- ²⁸ For kingship belongs to the LORD, and he rules over the nations.
- ²⁹All the prosperous of the earth eat and worship; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust, even the one who could not keep himself alive.
